

Edit - Add - Browse Form

Basic Page

Tabs are used to keep the form small, to present fewer pieces of information at once, and to push less frequently used information to back pages. Forms always have a Basic page.

Title Bar text has three parts: 1) The name of the business object in singular ("Customer"). 2) The name of the object being edited. ("A test Customer.") This is not displayed if the form is open for add and the name hasn't been entered yet. But is displayed when the user leaves the Name field. 3) The mode of the form: "Add", "Edit", or "Browse."

OK is the default button. In Add mode, it is not enabled until mandatory fields are completed.

Labels are left justified with a colon.

Combo boxes are used on lookup tables with fewer than 500 or so entries.

Box are used to group related fields on a page.

Check boxes and radio buttons may have left-justified labels positioned on the right.

A "Drill Down" button will bring up an edit form on the related record. In this case, the Desitributor.

Cancel abandons any changes without saving them. This should confirm the abandon if the user has made changes. ("You have made changes. Are you sure you want to abandon them?") Has the Cancel property.
